Subject :- Policy and guidlines for postings and transfers.

Sir,

I am directed to refer the subject noted above and to state that Government have decided that th following policy and guidelines should be followed while making postings and transfers of Governmen employees :-

- (i) In the interest of economy, the number of transfers should be kept to the minimum.
- (ii) In order to maintain continuity and in the interest of efficiency of work the minimum perio for continuously serving on a rost shall resmally the three years. Employees should no be transferred from a post earlier un'e s it is essential to do so on exceptional grounds ( public interest.
- (iii) The maximum period for continuously serving on a post shall normally be five years. Thi maximum period shall not be applicable in respect of the employees who are working i Colleges Schools and Labiratories including employees working in Industrial/Technica Training Institutions. This maximum period of the five years shall also not apply t Government employees both gazetted and non-gazetted, who are due to retire within the next two years and they may be allowed to continue on their present posts till retirement.
- (iv) Employees should be discouraged from approaching higher authorities by-passing the norms channels in the matter of their postings and transfers. It shoul be made clear that suc approach will render them liable to disciplinary action and suitable adverse entries will t made in their annual confidential reports. The copetent authorities should however, cons der sympathetically the cases involving hardship i.e. serious illness etc.
- (v) Gazetted officers should not be posted in their home districts with the exceptions enumerate below as kild.down in letter No. 8508-G1-8-25184, dated 16.8.1958 :-
  - (a) officers posted in the Secretariat;
  - (b) Heads of Departments:
  - (c) Divisional Commissioners;
  - (d) Superintending Engineers and similar officers in the other departments whose offici jurisdiction comprises more than one districts;
  - (e) Officers posted in the Offices of (b), (c) and (d) above;
  - (f) Professors and Senior Lecturers in the Education Department; and
  - (g) Doctors posted in the Medical Colleges in the State.
  - (vi) When husband and wife are in Government Service, it is desirable to keep the couple one station as far as possible. Even in cases where the wife is in Government Service as husband in under a private employment, it will be desirable to post the wife near or at t same place. Efforts should also be made to post unmarried girls and widows at statio suitable to them as far as possible. Unmarried girls and widows should be given preferen over couple cases in the matter of postings and transfers at stations convenient to them.
