Regarding Development, operation and monitoring of Centralized Digital Online Repository with search options, of all State Acts, Rules, Regulations, Government Orders (GOs), Circulars, Notifications, Policies, and relevant official documents (incl. rules/regulations at the municipal level) organized by sector, policy area, and last updated date (Priority Area 22)- preparation of MS Word document/file and review of all state acts, rules, regulations etc.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention to the subject cited above and to convey that Government is developing a Centralized Digital Online Repository with search options, of all State Acts, Rules, Regulations, Government Orders (GOs), Circulars, Notifications, Policies, and relevant official documents (incl. rules/regulations at the municipal level) organized by sector, policy area, and last updated date. All documents mentioned above are to be uploaded on Repository/Portal, as it will become operational soon. Also, all the State Acts, Rules, Regulations, Government Orders, etc., are required to be rationalized/repealed/amended based on the 6 principles outlined in the recommendations of Action Plan for Priority Area 22 (copy attached) as mentioned below:-

Principle 1: License or prior approval should be required only for activities that pose a serious risk. Approvals/licenses should be changed to self registration in all other cases.

Principle 2: Lifetime validity for all licenses; any periodic fee to be paid can be separated from license validity; inspections by department or third party can be used to amend or revoke licenses if critical conditions are not being met.

Principle 3: Regulations must only target desired outcomes and not specify processes. Those regulations that specify processes must be removed and made into guidelines.

Principle 4: Allow qualified independent third parties to conduct inspections conditions both at issuance and periodically, and onboard sufficient accredited agencies to ensure effective, transparent, and timely compliance checks.


Principle 5: Inspections should be risk based and randomly assigned, with clear checklists to ensure transparency and fairness. Where possible, they should be joint or led by accredited third party agencies to improve efficiency, reduce overlap, and ensure wider coverage.

Principle 6: All Acts/Rules/Circulars which are either outdated or redundant must be repealed/ withdrawn.

2. It is, therefore, kindly requested to prepare MS Word document/file (soft copy/ editable mode) of all documents mentioned above, separately, for ready reference, well before 25th June, 2026, so that same can be uploaded on the Repository, as soon as the Repository/Portal becomes operational.

3. Further, it is also requested to review and identify all the Acts, Rules, Regulations, etc., which are required to be rationalized/repealed/amended based on the six principles outlined in the recommendations of Action Plan for Priority Area 22 (copy attached) and do away with such Acts, Rules, Regulations, etc. either through ordinance or amendment latest by 30th June, 2026. Also an action taken report be sent in this matter by 3rd July, 2026 at political2.hry@gmail.com.
